2. Tire Rotation (Every 7,500 Miles): Essential for the front-wheel-drive (FWD) layout to prevent uneven wear on the MacPherson strut front suspension.
3. Air Filter Replacement (Every 30,000 Miles): However, many 2008 Focus models equipped with the PZEV (Partial Zero Emissions Vehicle) rating feature a 'lifetime' air filter system that does not require service for up to 150,000 miles. Technicians must verify the airbox type before attempting replacement.
4. Spark Plug Replacement (Every 90,000 Miles): The Duratec 20 uses platinum-tipped plugs. The gap must be precisely set to 1.3mm (0.051 inch) to ensure optimal combustion and prevent coil-on-plug (COP) failure.

The Evolution of In-Car Technology: Ford SYNC (2008 Debut)

The 2008 Focus was a flagship vehicle for the introduction of **Ford SYNC**, developed in collaboration with Microsoft. The technical manual devotes a significant supplement to this system. SYNC integrates the vehicle's audio system with mobile devices via Bluetooth and USB.

Theoretical Framework of SYNC v1

The SYNC system operates on the **Windows Embedded Automotive** platform. It utilizes a dedicated module (APIM - Accessory Protocol Interface Module) located behind the center console. The technical manual outlines the **Occupant Classification System (OCS)**, which uses sensors in the passenger seat to determine the weight of the occupant. This data determines the deployment force of the dual-stage airbags.

Braking System Mechanics

The braking system is a split-diagonal circuit. Most 2008 models featured front discs and rear drums. The technical specifications for the front rotors are as follows:
